Now Google Scholar connects you to SUNY Optometry's full-text journals

Why is this news?

As you know, **Google Scholar** takes the most popular search engine in the world and uses it to search the scholarly literature. Unlike regular Google, which can turn up almost anything found on the Internet, searching Google Scholar will lead you to peer-reviewed articles, theses, books, and abstracts.

Now, when you see "**See it @ SUNY Optometry**" after the title of a work found through Google Scholar, you can connect directly to the full-text article the search has found.

How does Google Scholar know I'm from SUNY Optometry?

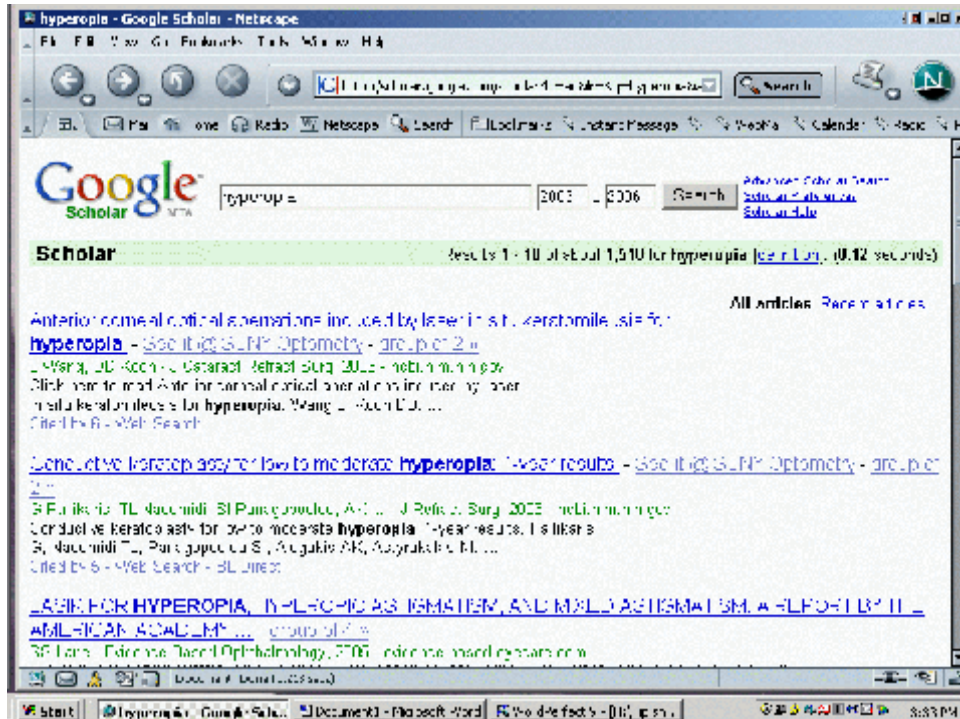
We provided Google Scholar with our IP addresses, so if you are searching from a computer on campus, it will automatically tell you what you have the rights to view.

If you are not on campus, go to **Google Scholar** and select **Scholar Preferences**. Go to **Library Links**. In the search box, type **SUNY Optometry** and click on **Find**. Select **SUNY Optometry**. Google Scholar will then know to alert you when something it finds is available to you.

How does this work?

- , Conduct a Google Scholar search. Use **Advanced Scholar Search** to search by keywords, publication date, author, or subject area. This will give you more precise results than the Basic Search option.
- , Whenever your search retrieves an article to which we have full-text rights, you will see **See it @SUNY Optometry** right next to the title of the document.
- , Click on **See it @SUNY Optometry** and you will be taken to a menu. This menu will give you several choices for accessing the full-text version of the article, but all of them should work.

- If the journal requires a password or other authentication (SUNY user ID and password) for full-text access, you will need to enter it.

How else can I access full-text articles available to me as a member of the SUNY Optometry Community?
